# Wilton Student Financial Aid Committee (WSFAC) FAQs

# What factors determine how much aid I will get?

- Need. Need is determined by Mr. William Hawkins, our outside financial consultant.
- Size of the gap. We look at the gap between the cost of your college and any other financial aid you receive, as well as your family's expected contribution.
- The number of applicants.
- The amount of donations we receive.
- How well past recipients are paying back their loans.

# What kinds of financial assistance do you provide?

- GRANTS for applicants who are Wilton residents and/or recent graduates of Wilton High School
  and are enrolled as *full-time undergraduate* students. These are gifts that do not need to be
  paid back.
- LOANS in amounts up to \$4,000/year. Loans need to be paid back.

What is the maximum amount of aid that WSFAC will provide? \$4,000/year is the maximum amount that will be *loaned* to a student. The grant amounts vary from year to year.

**Can I apply for money every year I am in college?** You can reapply each year that you are a *full-time undergraduate* student for up to six years. Applications are available on our website <a href="https://www.WSFAC.org">www.WSFAC.org</a> and are due every year by April 15.

What is the interest on the loans provided by WSFAC? 5%/year. Loans are interest free during the time that you are enrolled as a *full-time undergraduate* student.

When will I know how much I have been awarded? Award letters go out in early June.

# Once I am approved for an award what else do I need to do?

- Include a list of three people who do not live with you as personal references. Co-signers do not count as one of the three people.
- Return the completed, signed and notarized Promissory Note promptly.
- Make sure we have your college ID number and the proper address for payments so we can ensure that your payments are applied properly.
- Notify us of any changes in your
  - Contact information (phone, email, mailing address)
  - College status
- Respond promptly to any communication you receive from us

# How do I get my money?

After your Promissory Note has been received, half of your award amount will be sent to your college's financial aid or bursar's office in mid-July. You will receive a copy of the letter to the college. The remaining half will be sent in early December. You will receive a copy of the letter to the college and your next year's application.
